

#### Weather

Boulder is 5,430 feet in elevation and has a sunny, semi-arid climate. University of Colorado Boulder



In Boulder, Colorado, the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) supports a powerful array of research, data collection and dissemination programs, and operational weather forecasts of Earth's atmosphere and the space environment. Most of NOAA's Boulder activities take place in the David Skaggs Research Center at Broadway Street and Rayleigh Road. NOAA's Boulder portfolio goes back to the early 1950s, when the Central Radio Propagation Laboratory moved to town to conduct cutting-edge research on atmospheric processes and solar impacts.
